The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes short again and again, because there is no effort without error and shortcoming; but who does actually strive to do the deeds; who knows great enthusiasms, the great devotions; who spends himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who neither know victory nor defeat."

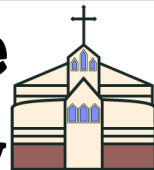
A word from Bro. Steve

The Bible is such a timely book. It's a book of wisdom. It's a book that doesn't give us fuzzy terms and make us wonder where we stand. It calls some wise and it calls others fools. It clearly points out, and has for thousands of years, that man apart from God cannot govern himself. Solomon saw this way back in the tenth century B.C. He wrote in Ecclesiastes 10:5-7: "There is an evil I have seen under the sun. An error proceeding from the ruler: Folly is set in great dignity (exalted positions), while the rich sit in a lowly place. I have seen servants on horses, while princes walk on the ground like servants."

The Living Bible says it like this: "There is another evil I have seen as I have watched the world go by, a sad situation concerning Kings and rulers- For I have seen foolish men given great authority, and rich men not given this rightful place of dignity! I have even seen servants riding, while princes walk like servants!" We may well think that these verses show prejudice in favor of the aristocracy and against people of humble backgrounds. But Ecclesiastes 4:13 shows respect for a humble person who has drive and ability. So let's take out the fact that some are rich and some are poor, and understand that the one who has the ability, the discernment, the wherewithal to handle authority and make intelligent decisions is, of all things, treated like a slave. The one who really cannot take a responsible position is on horseback and in control of the situation.

Here is the unhappy condition that prevails when incompetent people are in authority and place their friends in authority who are incompetent as well. Solomon says "this is evil!" In our modern world the leadership problem is the same as it was when Solomon penned Ecclesiastes. This is true because human nature is always the same. As a result of total depravity in man, folly is set today in great dignity. Yet, God's people must remember that in God's sovereign providence, our Creator has, at times, seen fit to allow fools to attain places of power. By faith we know that this is ultimately for our greater good and His glory. Still, we rightly sense that something is wrong when we see fools in power. One day this will be overturned, and the world will be "right side up again". God delights in leaders with integrity. Soon the Lord Jesus Christ is coming back and integrity will be restored. Knowing that truth encourages us to serve Him.
